

STORY BEHIND SERIOIPITY

The wonderfully onomatopoeic serendipity, which is indeed often chosen as Britain's' favourite English word, means the making of happy and unexpected discoveries by accident.

It was invented by the writer and politician Horace Walpole in 1754 as an allusion to Serendip, an old name for Sri Lanka. Walpole was a prolific letter writer, and he explained to one of his main correspondents that he had based the word on the title of a fairy tale, The Three Princes of Serendip, the heroes of which 'were always making discoveries, by accidents and sagacity, of things they were not in quest of '.

Incidentally, the original Persian name for Sri Lanka (and in earlier times Ceylon) was Sarandib, a corruption of the Sanskrit Sinhaladvipa which literally meant 'the island where lions dwell'.




cuisine. For them, the ever-delicious healthy food served in the main canteen is always there.

I then asked if they knew Mithali Raj or Tania Sachdev, Harshini Kanhekar, Bachendri Pal or even the recent headline grabber Puja Thakur? Merely two hands went up amidst that group of educated young women. That's less than 1% of the audience that day. The Indian women's cricket team captain, a FIDE World Chess Grandmaster, India's first female firefighter, the first Indian woman to scale Mt. Everest and the Wing Commander from IAF who led the Tri-guard of honour when Obama visited India last year are nowhere in our memory. A striking reality that sums up the fact that we celebrate and appreciate male achievers much more. A Mother Teresa or a Mary Kom are few and far between.

There could be a hundred struggles for any man to overcome and become successful. Add social and domestic barriers to these and a woman's struggle to success becomes even harder. People talk about empowerment of women. I personally believe that empowerment is already available to women. We don't need to create anything new. Women need to appreciate women achievers as much as they glorify and extoll their male counterparts. The spirit must be celebrated and pride derived within the fraternity.

As an HR professional, I have recruited thousands of fresh job seekers. Almost an equal number of men and women start their careers. MIRROR'S EDGE CATALYST

Initial gameplay of Mirror's Edge Catalyst was demonstrated at Gamescom in August, The excitement and thrill of fans are intense as they couldn't wait to see more of what EA has in store for Faith. With its predecessor proving a cult favourite, just the mere notion of seeing an improbable sequel was enough to fill them with excitement and anticipation. Having had two bites at the cherry, with this closed beta providing an extensive amount of gameplay, fans of the first will find plenty to love in Catalyst.

For starters this is indeed a sizeable chunk of game for a beta. EA has given players a decent amount of story content and side missions in this closed offering. After the opening tutorial section you'll meet numerous characters set to play a key role in the main narrative. However, due to the limited scope of the beta, it was hard

to grasp exactly what ramifications Birdman, Noah, Dogen and the other characters Faith is introduced to will play.

Discovering Faith's origin story is intriguing, and this isn't the time to do it. This is a time to run around the city of Glass, and see how Faith has evolved her free-running skills since 2008.

Catalyst delivers a wonderful sense of flow. Running round and hitting the objects emblazoned in red as Faith leaps, slides, wall runs and rolls her way around Glass is an absolute joy. At full speed, it's unlike anything else.

KrugerSec patrols litter rooftops, and the beauty of Mirror's Edge is you aren't forced to stop and fight them; most of the time you're encouraged to keep running. And that's good, because hand-to-hand combat - while a huge improvement over the first game - still isn't always as smooth as you'd like it to be.

All in all, Mirror's Edge Catalyst is shaping up to be an excellent offering. Its focused gameplay makes players excited for what's to come. There are of course plenty of questions that beta can't answer: Will the world be big enough and varied enough to keep us interested? Is the story strong enough to grip us? Will there be enough variety to gameplay to satiate players who want to keep coming back for more? Based on what we have seen it's hard not to enjoy every free running moment you explore the upper echelons of Glass.




BOOKWORMS HANGOUT

ENDER'S GAME By Orson Scott Card

Often regarded as a contemporary sci-fi classic, Orson Scott Card's Ender's Game is an interesting narrative of a military commander's thought processes seen through the eyes of children. This perspective allows Card to attempt to tackle the moral dilemmas that such a leader might have to face, and how they grow through these phases to maintain a level head. The writing is simple enough to get this point across, but it's almost too simple, to the point of twodimensionality of characterization and story-telling. This also reappears in the depiction of the negative characters, and the less-than-progressive viewpoints that creep into the book. Ender's Game, then, is a military sci-fi tale that offers intriguing lessons on military leadership, but is far from a shining example of literature.



SLAUGHTERHOUSE-FIVE By Kurt Vonnegut

Slaughterhouse-Five is a fatalistic reflection of the lives we all live, have lived, and will live, told through the eyes of a man who has lived through both the most chaotic and mundane. It is a book that will interweave with your own life, reaffirming its flow with the simple fact that all life is what you make of it in the moment. So it goes.






RENAISSANCE 16




